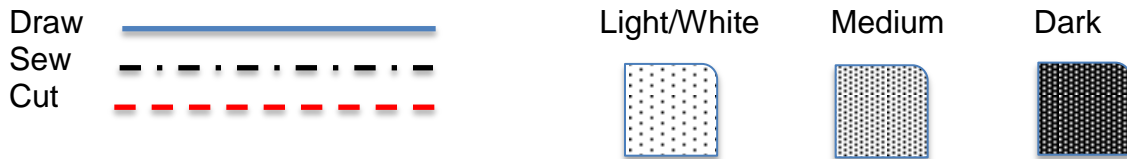

Traditional Quilt Option

Key

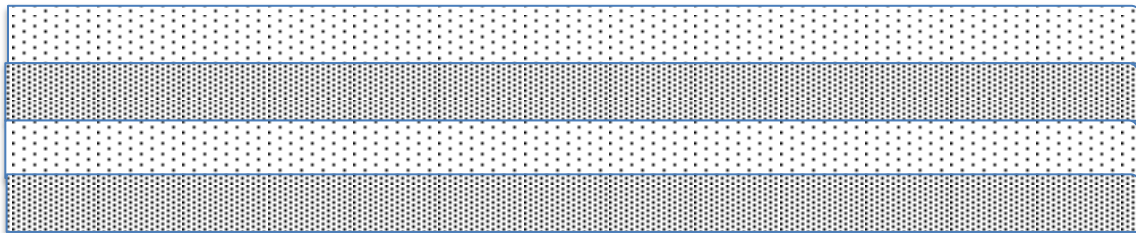
All seams are 1/4".



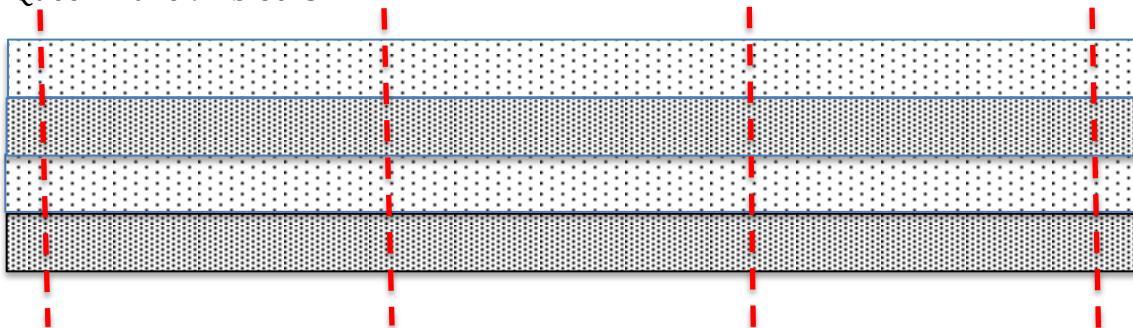
Step 1

Sew two light 2-1/2" wide WOF (width of fabric) strips and two medium 2-1/2" wide WOF strips lengthwise together, alternating colors, as shown below.

7 sets WOF for Wall/Throw; 9 sets for Twin; 23 sets for Queen.



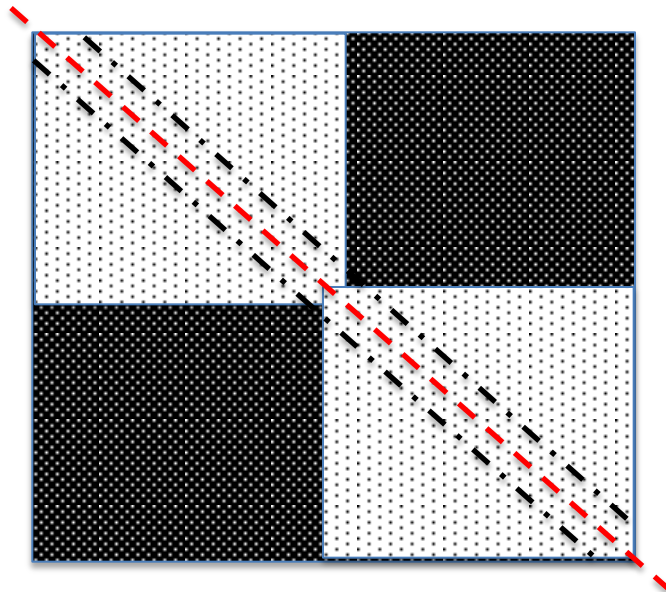
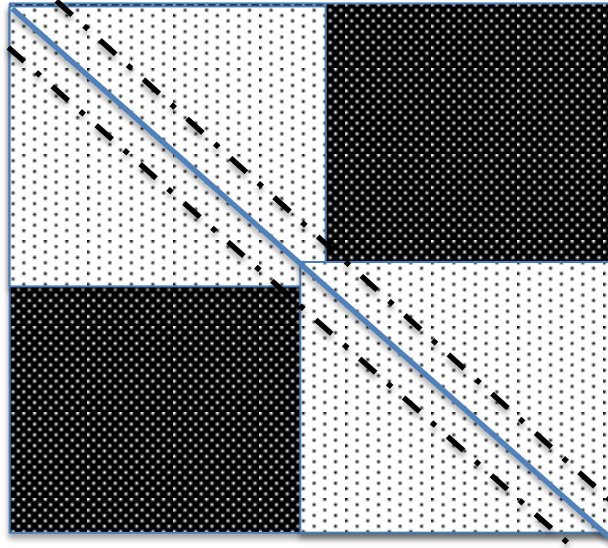
Cut into 8-1/2" square blocks. Wall/Throw make 28 blocks; Twin make 36 blocks; Queen make 92 blocks.



Step 2

Face two 2-7/8" light squares right sides together with one dark 5-1/4" square as shown. Draw a diagonal line (blue) from corner to corner and sew a scant quarter inch on each side of the line.

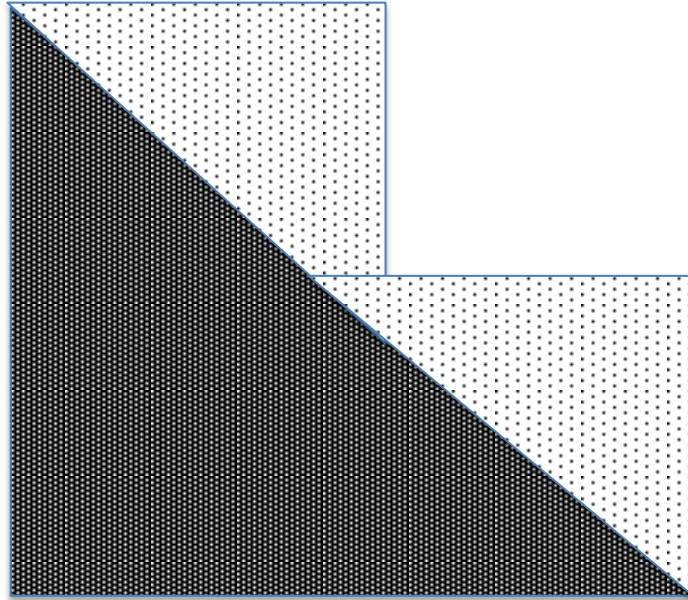
Wall/Throw make 13 sets; Twin make 23 sets; Queen make 53 sets.



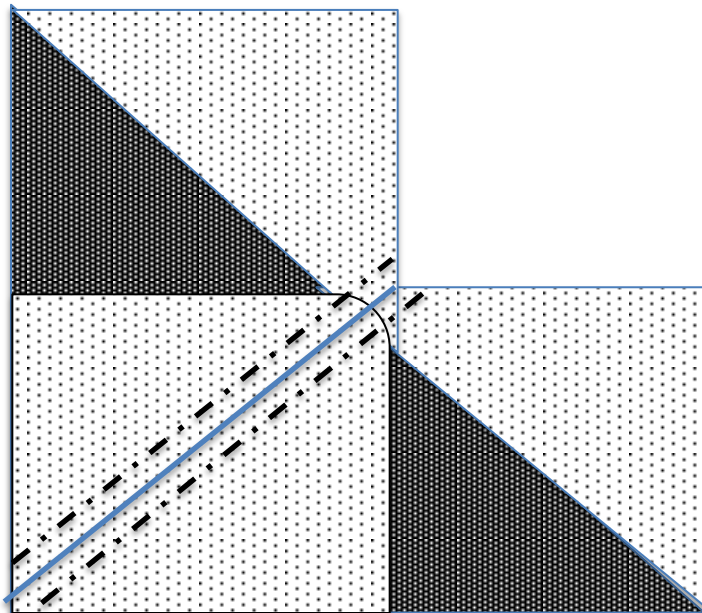
After sewing, cut on the drawn line (shown in red).

Step 3

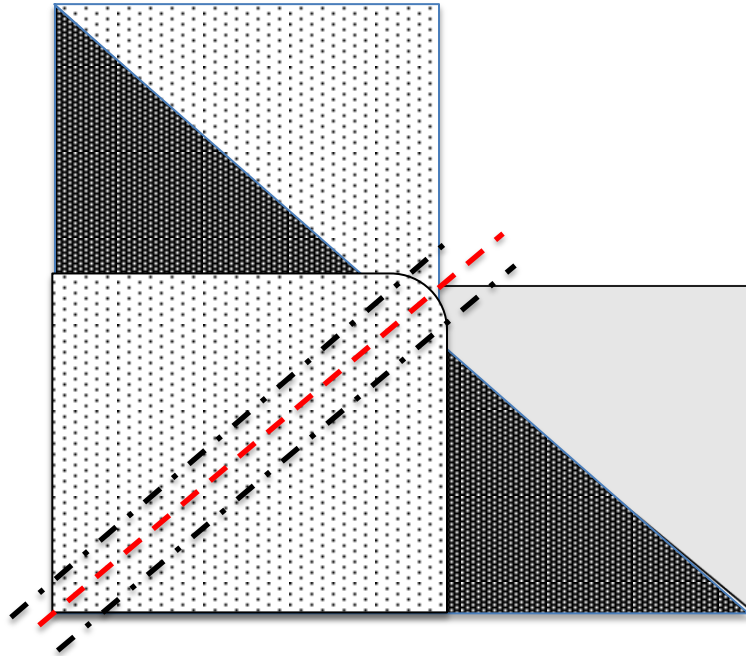
Press each unit open, towards the dark fabric.



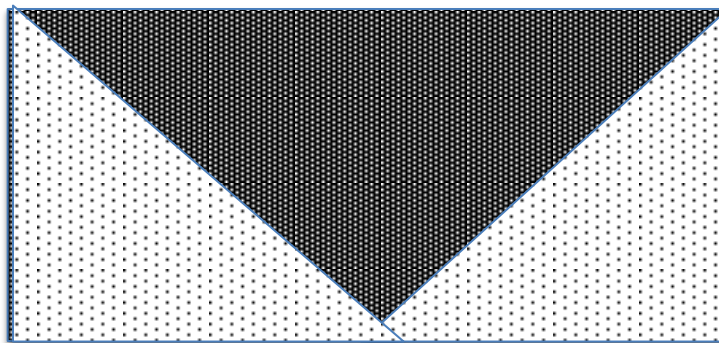
Place a $2\frac{7}{8}$ " light square right sides together with the dark fabric as shown. Draw diagonal a line across the center of light square (blue); sew one each side of the line.



Cut on the pencil line (red). Press open toward the dark fabric.

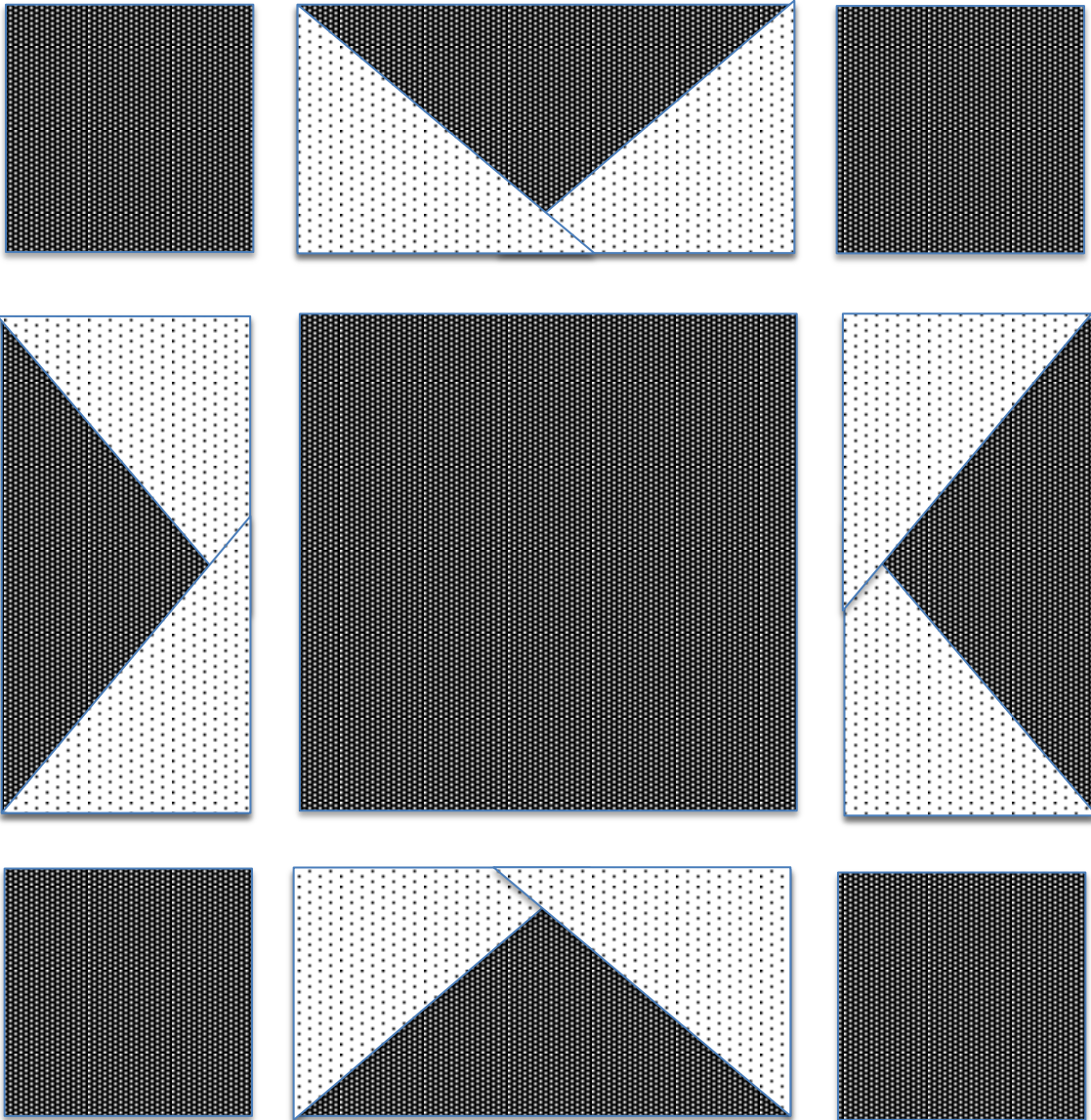


Square each flying goose to $2\frac{1}{2}$ x $4\frac{1}{4}$. There should be a quarter inch of seam allowance beyond the point of the dark fabric.



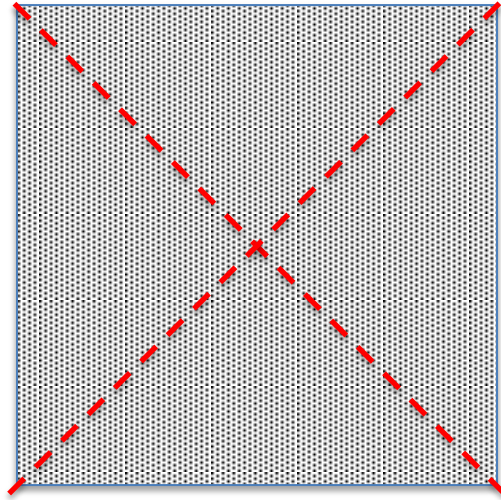
Step 4

Using four 2-1/2" dark squares, one 4-1/2" light square and four flying geese, assemble the star blocks as shown. Wall/Throw make 13 stars; Twin make 23 stars; Queen make 53 stars.



Step 5

Cut 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on the diagonal in each direction to get 4 triangles from each square.



Cut the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on the diagonal to get two triangles from each square.
